
Accelerated, unequal - regionally and intraurban Over 3 million households in precarious settlements







2007 - 2017

PAC Slum Upgrading – **federal transfers / grants** – R\$ 2 bi 11 projects – 8 areas/precarious settlements

2005 - 2010

Municipal fiscal resources – R\$ 2 bi State revenues (water fees) – R\$ 0.5 bi

Focus on 9 areas /precarious settlements (out of 55)

2010: 1,3 million slum dwellers (12% population)

2096 slums 50% women

70% income up to USD 500/month
